



## COMMUNICABLE DISEASES Communicable Disease Control

In order to prevent the spread of communicable disease and to ensure rapid recovery with a minimum of after effects, children should be kept out of school when they show any symptoms of a communicable disease, such as a sore throat, skin rash, cough, etc.

If these symptoms develop into any communicable disease, other than the common cold, parents are asked to notify the school immediately.

Children between the ages of six and sixteen years of age are legally requNew York Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and school on a regular basis. 


